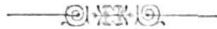

THE UNIVERSITY MUSICAL SOCIETY and THE ANN ARBOR CHORAL UNION have been organized for the purpose of combining all the available talent, vocal and instrumental, both in the University and in the city, and for advancing musical attainment and taste to the highest possible standard.

To enable the friends of musical culture to support us in this enterprise, we propose to give an annual series of Musical Entertainments, commencing with the next University year. They will consist partly of semi-public rehearsals, and partly of public concerts; the rehearsals to be given three times in each semester; the concerts twice, or, if possible, several times during the year. Tickets of admission to the whole series will be issued at the beginning of the next semester, and the terms then specified.
