PROGRAM NOTES

Quartet in F major, Op. 41, No. 2

SCHUMANN

Of Schumann's three string quartets this is the most difficult, both for the listener and the performer. It is very seldom played on chamber music programs. The performance of this master work should not be neglected, however, but must be presented only to the most discriminating audiences. It is full of romantic poetry, fantasy, and vigor—characteristic of Schumann.

Quartet No. 2 (dedicated to the Roth Quartet) . . HAROLD MORRIS

Morris is one of the outstanding composers of the United States. His chamber music is his forte and his trio, the quartets, and piano quintet have been performed with excellent success throughout the country. His Second Quartet is superbly written for the instruments. It has emotional power and rhythmical variety. It is a modern work with a strong personal flavor, but it is not harmonically extreme.

Choral and Fugue (transcribed by Daniel Gregory Mason) . BRAHMS

Daniel Gregory Mason, one of America's leading composers, has greatly enriched the string quartet repertoire with a fine transcription of a truly fine work. Mr. Mason, a personal friend of long standing of the Roth Quartet, has dedicated this transcription to them.
