†Folga Nego (Afro-Brazilian Batuque) . Collected by GAO GURGEL
Dance, Negro, dance! The white man will not come. If he does, kill him with a club. Negro, you work night and day. This night you will dance untroubled all over the coffee clearing. You will dance and curse and kill if the white man comes. (In 18th century Brazil, the African slaves imported to work the coffee plantations were forbidden to perform any of their native dances or rituals).
Good Evening, Mrs. Flanagan VIVIAN MEADE A calypso from Jamaica, discussing a familiar problem.
*Creole Folksongs (sung in Creole French): . Arr. CAMILLE NICKERSON Creole songs of Louisiana originated on the plantations of French and Spanish colonists. They were created in much the same manner as the work songs and spirituals of the American Negro, but whereas the latter largely is a product of American environment, the Creole reflects the influence of the Latin background.
Gué Gué Solingaie (Lullaby)
Sleep, baby, sleep, mother hovers near. I have said the tortoise knows how to talk, the crocodile knows how to sing, and the wildcat may steal you away.
Micheu Banjo (Dance Song)  See that little mulatto there, Mister Banjo, struttin' so "biggety-big," hat cocked on one side, walkin' cane swingin' wide, smokin' a big cigar, struttin' to beat the band. Hair all slick and bright red tie and new shoes cryin' "crank, crank, crank" while his eyes roll after each girl he meets. Flower in his buttonhole, he thinks he's quite a devil. But we can also play that game, Mister Banjo.
