Scene 1. A Hall in the Castle

Midsummer festivities are is preparation. Julie, returning from her morning ride, is infuriated by the maids' decoration of the old family portraits. She hates her family and demands that Jean, her headservant, remove the decorations.

Her father, the Duke, arrives with her fiancé, whom she also dislikes despite his noble birth. She provokes him into breaking the engagement and then finds herself alone while the others enjoy the festivities.

Scene 2. The Dance in the Barn

At the high point of the dance Julie enters and requests that Jean escort her; he obeys reluctantly. Their dance becomes hectic and wild until he senses the stares of the others and runs away.

Scene 3. The Kitchen

Kristin, Jean's fiancée, awaits his return. Upon his arrival he tells her of Julie's strange behavior. At that moment Julie enters and asks the hesitant Jean to join her outside. He is drawn to her and when Kristin leaves the kitchen, he gives in to his desire to seduce Julie. When the lovers hear noise outside, Jean carries Julie to his own quarters, and the peasants invade the room. After the mob leaves, however, Jean finds that his attitude toward Julie has changed considerably; he now thinks of her as a "fallen woman."

At the ringing of the bell, near dawn, Jean arises to go about his duties—the polishing of the duke's boots. Julie, now afraid to face her father, begs Jean to run away with her. Frantic, she runs about the castle, taking with her the family jewels.

Scene 4. A Hall in the Castle

Julie's ancestors stare at her disapprovingly; as in a nightmare she sees them steadily approach. She cannot escape; the family forces her to that one and only solution worthy of her rank. In order to find the courage necessary to take her own life she turns to Jean for help.
