French String Trio: Pathe and Seraphim Records Michel Debost: Seraphim, Angel, and Nonesuch Records The French String Trio was founded in 1959 and since then has received acclaim in Europe, North and South America, Africa, and Scandinavia.

Gerard Jarry, one of France's best known violinists, launched his concert career in 1951 when he won the Grand Prize at the Marguerite Long-Jacques Thibaud International Competition. Mr. Jarry is often guest artist with other ensembles and chamber orchestras throughout Europe. Since 1969 he has also performed as soloist with the J. F. Paillard Chamber Orchestra, recording all the works for chamber orchestra by Mozart.

Serge Collot began his formal training at the Paris Conservatory, studying under Maurice Vieux, Joseph Calvet, Roger Desormière, and Arthur Honegger. He was an original member of the Parrenin Quartet, founded in 1942, and later was a moving force in "Les Concerts du Domain Musical," a small group of musicians centering around Pierre Boulez. Today he also teaches viola and chamber music at the Paris Conservatory and the Academie Internationale d'Ete in Nice.

Michel Tournus studied at the Paris Conservatory where he won First Prize in cello in the class of Pierre Fournier. He has appeared frequently on French Radio and Television, both as a soloist with the orchestra and in chamber music, and performs with orchestras throughout Europe.

Michel Debost has concertized extensively in Europe, Russia, and Japan, winning first prizes in Moscow, Prague, Munich, Geneva, and Rome. For sixteen years he has given duo recitals with pianist Christian Ivaldi, participated in most of Europe's major music festivals, and performed with major orchestras under Josef Krips, Herbert von Karajan, and Daniel Barenboim. In addition, he has been first flutist of the Orchestra de Paris since 1967.
