On Monday, January 31, 1910, a block of 500 seats will be placed on sale at \$3.50 each. On Monday, February 7, all unsold seats from this block will be offered at \$3.00 each and will remain at this price up to and during the Festival.

On Monday, February 14, a block of 1000 additional seats will be placed on sale at \$2.50 each. On Saturday, February 19, all unsold seats from this block will be offered at \$2.00 each, and will remain at this price up to and during the Festival.

On Monday, February 28, 1910, a block of approximately 1000 additional seats will be placed on sale at \$1.50 each. On Saturday, March 5, all unsold seats from this block will be offered at \$1.00 each and will remain at this price up to and during the Festival.
