SCHEDULE OF PRICES

Reserved seat tickets for the Festival may be secured by returning Choral Union season tickets and paying the reservation fee in accordance with the following schedule:

On Monday, February 20, a block of 500 seats will be placed on sale at \$3.50 each. On Monday, February 27, all unsold seats from this block will be offered at \$3.00 each and will remain at this price up to and during the Festival.

On Monday, March 6, a block of 1000 additional seats will be placed on sale at \$2.50 each. On Saturday, March 11, all unsold seats from this block will be offered at \$2.00 each, and will remain at this price until the Festival.

On Monday, March 13, a block of approximately 1000 additional seats will be placed on sale at \$1.50 each. On Saturday, March 18, all unsold seats from this block will be offered at \$1.00 each and will remain at this price until the Festival.
