SPECIAL NOTICE: The new Federal tax law effective April 1 provides that the tax on concert tickets shall be increased from 10 to 20 per cent. Accordingly, the prices of May Festival tickets will continue until that date as follows: season tickets, \$8.80, \$7.70, and \$6.60; individual concert tickets, \$2.75, \$2.20, \$1.65,

Beginning April 1, the prices, including the increased Federal tax, will be: season tickets, \$9.60, \$8.40, and \$7.20; individual concert tickets, \$3.00, \$2.40, \$1.80, and \$1.20.
